WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

Type: Butler Credit Opportunities Fund (the "Fund") is a sub-fund of CORUM Butler Credit Strategies ICAV, an umbrella open-ended collective asset-management vehicle with segregated liability between Funds formed in Ireland under the Irish Collective Asset-management Vehicles Act 2015 and authorised by the Central Bank of Ireland as an undertaking for collective investment in transferable securities pursuant to the European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) Regulations 2011, as amended. Segregated liability between Funds means that the assets and liabilities of each Fund are segregated by law. The prospectus and periodic reports are prepared for CORUM Butler Credit Strategies at the umbrella level. You may switch your shares in the Fund to shares in other Funds in which you are eligible to invest. Further information is available from Northern Trust International Fund Administration Services (Ireland) Limited (the administrator of the Fund).

Objectives: The investment objective of the Fund is to seek to achieve attractive risk-adjusted returns over time. The Fund will invest in fixed income securities (i.e. bonds, Negotiable Debt Securities, debentures and promissory notes which pay a fixed or floating rate of interest over a fixed time period) and equity securities, mainly in Europe. Typically, the Fund will have at least 80% in fixed income and up to 20% in equity securities. Fixed income securities are debt instruments (such as bonds) issued by a government, a corporation or other entity which provide investors with a return in the form of periodic coupon payments and eventual return of their investment. The fixed income securities will generally be a mix of investment grade (rated as lower risk), sub-investment grade (rated as higher risk), or may be unrated but it is possible they may all be sub-investment grade at times. The Fund may invest up to 20% of the Net Asset Value in Additional Tier 1 contingent convertible bonds (or AT1 CoCo bonds). The Fund's ability to invest in bonds will also include inflation-linked bonds. The Fund may take short positions in its investments. This means the Fund will make a profit if the value of the investment goes down, but it will lose money if the value of the investment goes up. Unless the loss is capped or offset by another investment, it could theoretically be unlimited.

The Fund may invest through index derivatives, which give broad market or sector exposure, and may use a range of other derivatives, such as total return swaps, inflation swaps, interest rate swaps, options, futures, credit default swaps or contracts for difference to invest indirectly in specific fixed income or equity investments. Derivatives may also be used for hedging purposes. A derivative is a contract between two or more parties whose value is based on an agreed-upon underlying financial asset, index or security. It is expected that by using derivatives, the Fund's long positions will typically be up to 350% of the net asset value of the Fund and short positions up to 250% at any given time. The Fund may invest in open-ended and closed-ended collective investment schemes and open-ended exchange traded funds which enable the Fund to achieve its investment objective. The Fund may also invest in cash and money market instruments for cash management purposes.

The Fund is actively managed, meaning the investment manager actively selects and invests the securities in which the Fund invests with the aim of meeting the investment objective of the Fund. The Fund does not track and is not managed by reference to any particular benchmark.

The investment policy of the Fund may involve a high level of trading and turnover of the investments of the Fund which may generate substantial transaction costs which will be borne by the Fund. These costs will be in addition to the charges set out in the "What are the costs?" section of this document.

The Fund seeks to promote environmental, social and governance ("ESG") characteristics and as such discloses in accordance with Article 8 of the Sustainable Finance Disclosure Regulation. The Fund does not have a sustainable investment objective. The Investment Manager takes ESG considerations into account as part of its investment decision making process and such considerations are implemented on a continuous basis as part of this process. Further detail on these considerations and the process is set out in the Supplement.

The shares are denominated in Euro (EUR) and are unhedged. The base currency of the Fund is EUR.

No income will be paid on your shares. You may sell your shares in the Fund every Wednesday provided it is a business day or the following business day where the relevant Wednesday is not a business day and the last business day of every month. A business day is a day that banks are open in Ireland and the United Kingdom. You must submit your application to the Fund's administrator before 1.00p.m. (Irish Time) two business days prior to the day on which you want to sell.

Intended Retail Investors: This Fund is suitable for investors seeking to achieve a return on their investment in the medium to long term and are willing to accept a high level of volatility. The investor should be prepared to bear losses.

Term: The Fund has no maturity date. The Management Company is entitled to terminate the Fund unilaterally.

The depositary of the Fund is Northern Trust Fiduciary Services (Ireland) Limited. COSTS OVER TIME
